INSTITUTIONS, SOCIAL AND INTERGENERATIONAL EQUITY

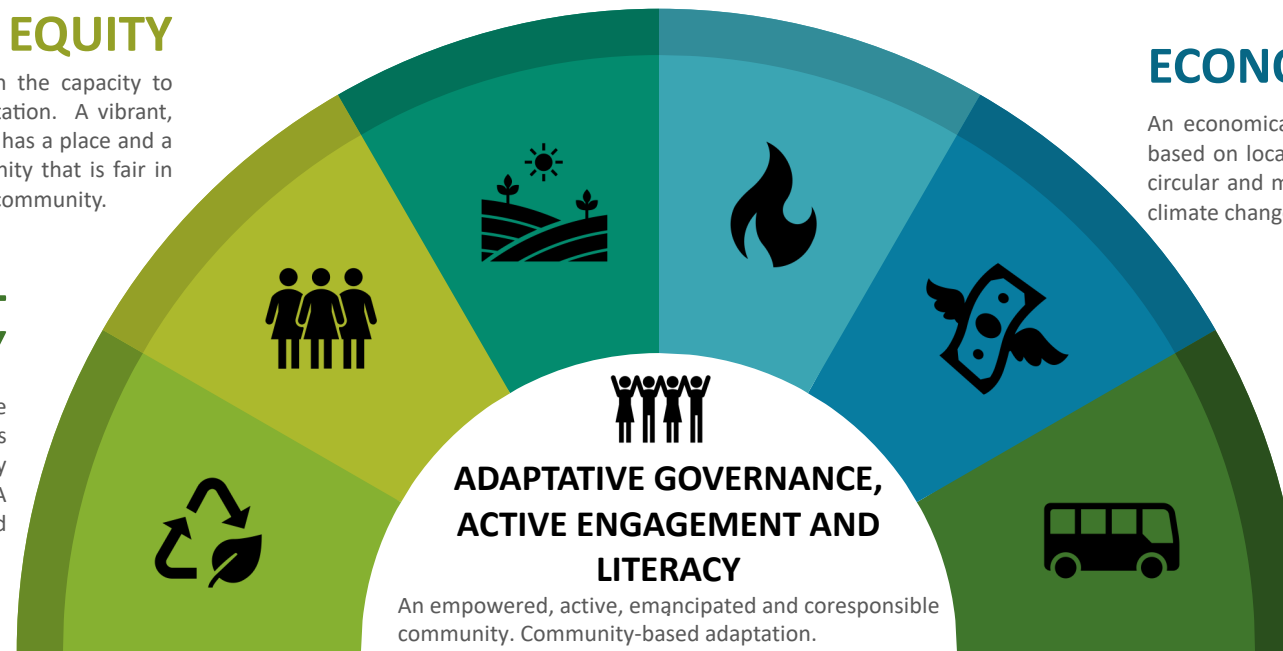
